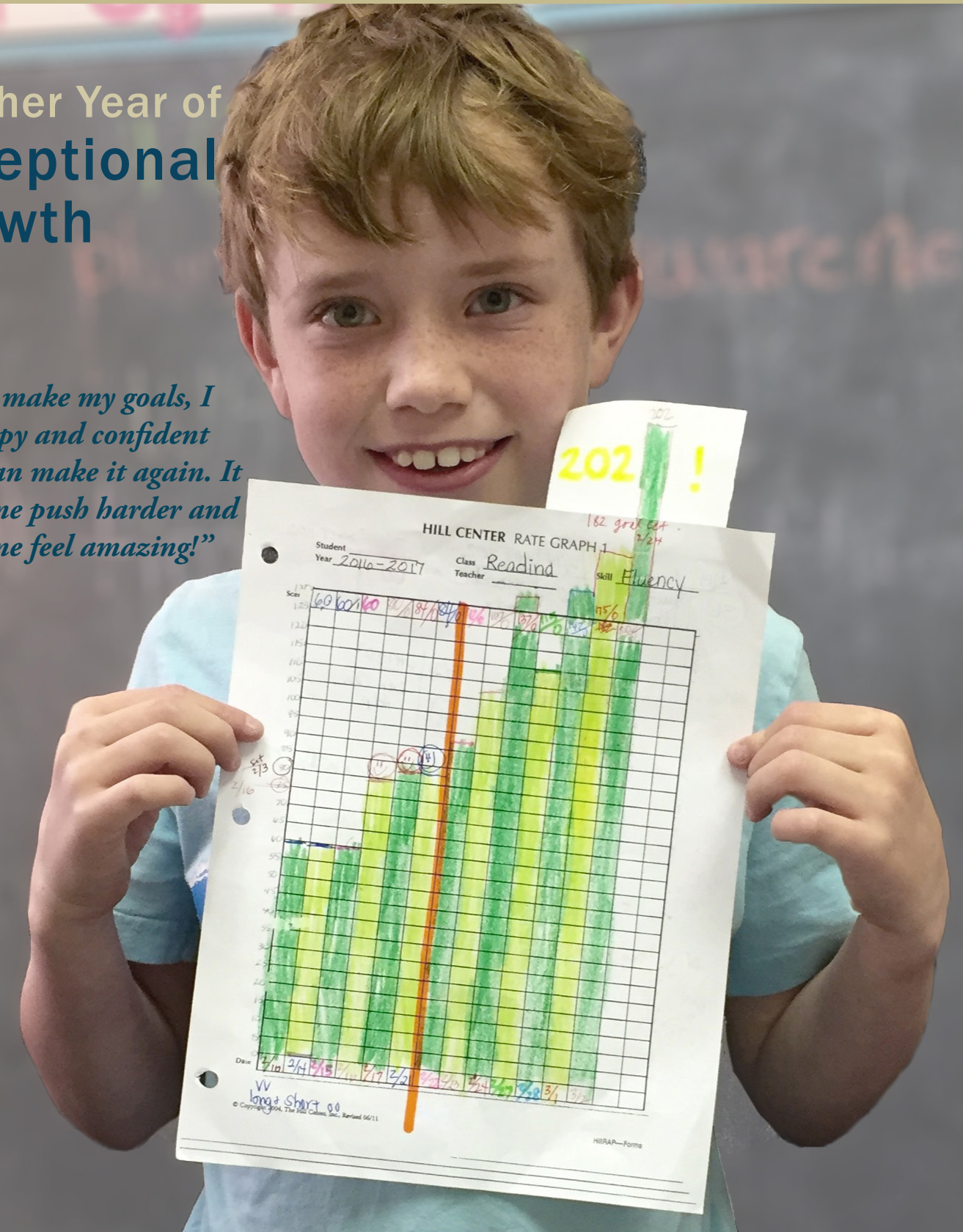

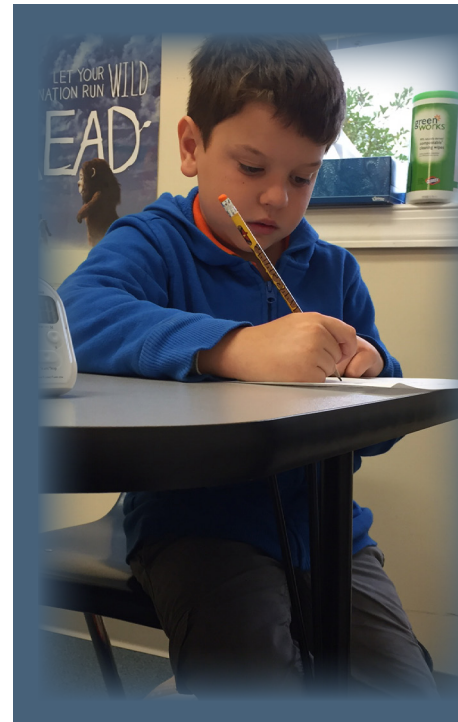
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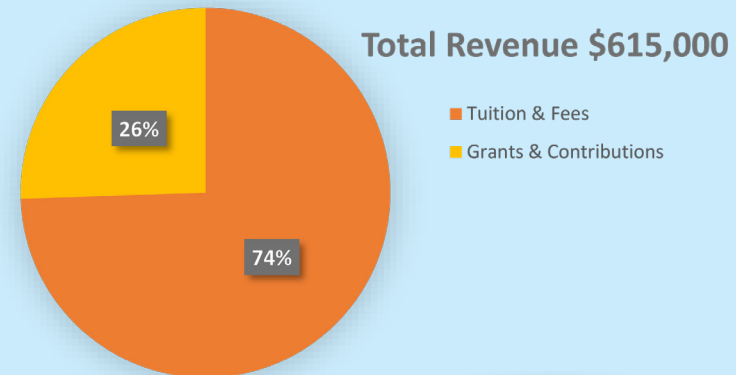


During the 2016-17 School year, The Hill School of Wilmington served 40 students in grades 1-8. The Hill School uses a research-based, multisensory structured language methodology to focus on reading, written language, and math, in a 4:1 student to teacher ration classroom setting.

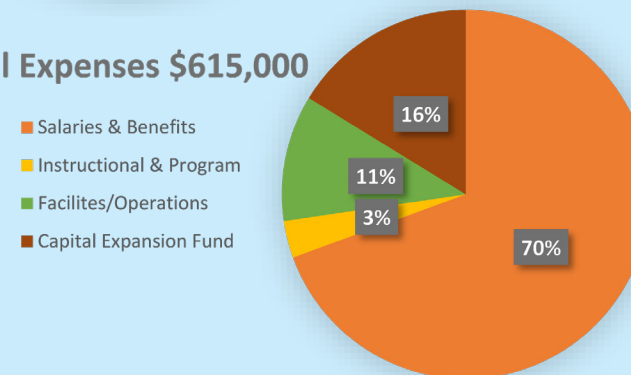
- Summer Program - The five-week 2016 Program served a total of 32 students.
- Workshops - "What Does a Learning Difference Look Like in the Regular Classroom" and "Technology Tools that Support Students," presented on the campus of University of North Carolina at Wilmington.

Total Expenses \$615,000

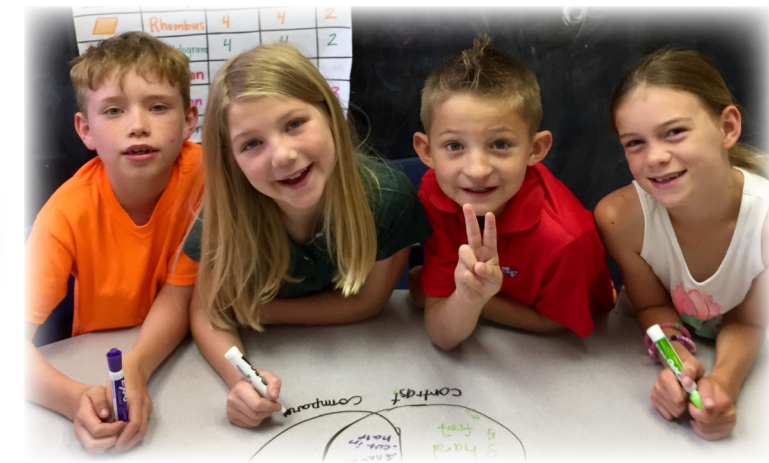
